### Type 1 Parenting:

### Type 2 Communicating:



Conduct effective communications from school-to-home and home-to-school about school programs and student progress.

### Type 3 Volunteering:



Organize volunteers and audiences to support the school and students. Provide volunteer opportunities in various locations and at various times.

### Type 4 Learning at Home:



Involve families with their children on homework and other curriculum-related activities and decisions.

### Type 5 Decision Making:



Include families as participants in school decisions, and develop parent leaders and representatives.

### Type 6 Collaborating with the Community:



Coordinate resources and services from the community for families, students, and the school, and provide services to the community. ©

### Georgia's ESEA Flexibility Waiver:

As of March 30, 2012, Georgia was granted a flexibility waiver from No Child Left Behind, allowing Georgia to continue to hold schools accountable while having flexibility in improving struggling schools. Schools are identified as Priority Schools, Focus Schools, Alert Schools and Reward Schools. **Lowndes County School System is proud to announce that it has not been designated as a Priority, Focus or an Alert School System.**

### Complaint Procedures

Any individual, organization or agency may file a complaint with the Local Education Agency (LEA) if that individual, organization or agency believes and alleges that the LEA is violating a federal statute or regulation under the Title I program. The complaint must allege a violation occurred not more than one year prior to the date the complaint is received, unless a longer period is reasonable because the violation is considered systemic or ongoing. A complaint should not be filed with the GaDOE until every effort has been made to resolve the issue locally. If complainant has tried to file a complaint with the LEA to no avail, the complainant must provide the GaDOE with written proof of their attempt to resolve the issue at the local level. ## Title I School-wide Programs

The purpose of School-wide (SW) Title I programs is to improve the entire educational program in a school which should result in improving the academic achievement of all students, particularly the lowest achieving students. The goal of such a program is to assist those students to demonstrate proficiency on academic standards. School-wide programs follow these three steps: 1. The Local Educational Agency (LEA) determines that the school serves an eligible attendance area. 2. For the first year of the School-wide program, the school serves a school attendance area in which at least 40% of the students enrolled in the school are from low-income families. 3. The school consults with stakeholders and makes the decision to become School-wide. School-wide programs are **not** required to identify specific students as eligible. They must supplement (enhance) rather

than supplant (take the place of) the services participating students would receive if they were not participating in the School-wide program. Lowndes County Schools and Title I have a strong focus on parental notification and involvement.



Lowndes County has five School-wide Title I schools.
